Our archival shot today is of Lar Lubovitch, back in the days when he was dancing in <u>his own</u> <u>company</u>, which he started 44 years ago.

This weekend Lar Lubovitch is showing a program of three fascinating works at Florence Gould Hall, and in two weeks he takes this rep to the **Kennedy Center**. One of the works, *Crisis Variations*, **earned him the Benois de la Danse** award in choreography—the first to go to an American. It's a beautifully odd and oddly beautiful interpretation of the idea of crisis. The premiere, *Transparent Things*, joins live music and dance in a poignant way.
